DVDG

- Multiagency group
- Police DCI chair
- Deputy chairs from County and City Councils
- Meets every 2 months
- Comprehensive LLR development plan
- Identifies threats, and opportunities to improve overall service to public in terms of DV



Developments & Challenges

- The police strategic assessment has been completed for the 2016-2017 period, using the MoRiLE cross agency assessment tool.
- This has placed Domestic Violence as one of 6 priorities in the control strategy
- Raises the profile of this work stream and thus improves access to resources where required.

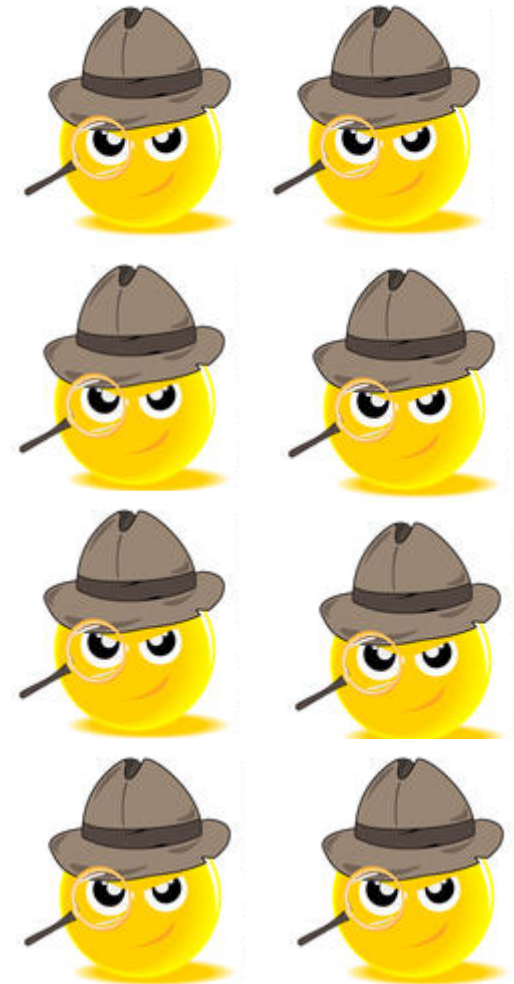

Developments and Challenges continued

- Launch of Operation Encompass in Leicestershire.
- Launch of the Sexual Assault Referral Centre
- Mapping of DV related referral pathways between key agencies.
- Developing DV perpetrator management program.



DV perpetrator management case study (RY)

- **Premise** – Perpetrators Identified by NPA, MARAC and DAIU (DVPN / Professional judgement)
- Uses IOM methodology (7 pathways)
- Multiagency approach

- **Hinckley example** – Adult male RY
- 15 police calls between July and Dec 15
- Multiple calls EMAS
- Additional demand on HBBC and Social Care
- Professionals Meeting was held Jan 2016 (Police, Probation, Child Social Services, HBBC, Drug intervention)
- Strategies agreed (Example - Fire safety checks by CFB / police SPOC encouraging RY to enter rehab)

- **Since interventions** – Only 2 further calls to police / EMAS
- Reduced demand on all agencies

Key issues for partnership working

Chairing of MARAC – At present all MARAC chairs are police officers. Other agencies need to provide staff to be trained as chairs to support this process.

DMU are working with the DVDG group to develop PPIT (Priority Perpetrator Identification Tool) - When in full use, this will be used to identify the DV perpetrators who are subject to multiagency IOM
