

Have your say on proposed changes to supported accommodation for older people in Leicestershire - Catherine Dalley Elderly Persons Home

Catherine Dalley House is a residential elderly person's home located in Melton Mowbray. It is in need of significant repairs that would cost up to £315,000. The council is proposing to support residents to move to suitable alternative accommodation and close Catherine Dalley House. Taking this into account, closing Catherine Dalley would make a net saving of £146,000 per year.

We would like to get your views about our proposal, the potential impact and any alternative ideas.
