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



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## Phase 1



- New ED opens 26<sup>th</sup> April 2017
  - Integrated Urgent Care
    Centre & Eye Casualty
  - Minors
  - Majors
  - Resus
  - Paediatric ED
  - New Paediatric short stay unit



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
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# Phase 2

- Opens Summer 2018. Includes:
  - Medical Assessment
    Units
  - Emergency Frailty Unit
    (EFU) and Acute Frailty
    Unit (AFU) co-located
  - GP Assessment Unit
  - Emergency Decisions
    Unit (EDU) ED
    observation ward







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## **Paediatric ED**

- Completely separate streams for children
- New 12 bedded short stay area
- Current "UCC" stream and paediatric ED stream managed in new department
- In July aim to move to single front door all GP admissions seen first in ED by joint paediatric and ED workforce.









- In Phase 1:
  - Some purpose built dementia friendly bays
  - Rubber floor (Anti-slip, decreased fracture risk from falls)
  - Vastly improved environment (privacy and dignity)
- In Phase 2
  - Co-located EDU, EFU, AFU
