Why does Leicestershire County Council get involved with this?

Leicestershire County Council is responsible for determining school term and holiday dates for community, voluntary-controlled, and community special schools in Leicestershire. Leicestershire County Council term dates are currently set until the end of the academic year 2018/19.

Does the county council set the school terms for all schools in Leicestershire?

No. Academies, voluntary-aided and foundation special schools determine their own school terms. As of autumn 2014, academies, including free schools, have had the freedoms to set their own term time patterns. They are also required to consult and consider all views before doing so.

Leicester City Council has a similar role to the county council with regards to setting school term and holiday dates for schools in the city of Leicester.

Please note this consultation therefore only applies to term dates for community, voluntary-controlled, and community special schools in Leicestershire.

Do all community, voluntary-controlled, and community special schools in Leicestershire have to adopt the school term and holiday dates set by Leicestershire County Council?

In principle, yes. However, there is some flexibility to allow schools to amend term time patterns in-line with academies that have moved away from our patterns. In Leicestershire several secondary academies have partially moved away from our model. This can result in siblings in different schools having different term time patterns, which causes difficulties with organising care arrangements and planning time off together as a family.

With this in mind, Leicestershire County Council has a recommended process that allows community schools to amend their term time patterns to fall in-line with the local secondary academy. In 2016/17 several community schools requested permission to amend their term patterns to align with the local academies. This process involves the community school running a short consultation with parents, staff, unions, other local schools and the County Council and where possible to give all parties at least a year's notice of any subsequent agreed change. We are not proposing any changes to these flexibilities.

Who determines the INSET days?

As part of teacher's statutory conditions of service, five days are required within term time for in-service training, known as INSET days. Leicestershire County Council traditionally set two fixed INSET days, but increasingly community schools write to request to alter INSET days to meet local needs and/or align themselves with other local academies. We are therefore proposing to allow the governing body of a school the responsibility for setting all five INSET days during the school calendar.

What is Leicestershire's current school term pattern?

Leicestershire traditionally has a different school term pattern compared to surrounding areas and most other parts of the country. Compared to other areas, Leicestershire currently has:

- An early autumn break (autumn half-term holiday).
- An early spring break (spring half-term holiday).
- An early start of the summer holiday that follows the so-called traditional 'industrial July fortnight' pattern (where the summer break includes the last two working weeks of July).

Why consult?

To ensure we can give schools and parents sufficient notice, we now need to consult on term time patterns for the following three academic years (2019/20; 2020/21 and 2021/22).

Previous consultations, that included opportunities to align school terms with surrounding areas have confirmed Leicestershire's unique pattern has been popular with the majority of parents. The pattern can however also cause issues for some parents and teachers, in particular when children in a single family attend schools with different term patterns or where teachers work at schools with different term patterns than those of the school attended by their children.

Leicestershire County Council therefore wants to consult parents, teachers and local businesses and residents on their preference: Should we maintain the current pattern or align school terms with surrounding areas?

The options in more detail

We have developed detailed term times proposals for 2019 – 2022 for all three options proposed. Please see below for more details. All options are based on the following key principles:

- . The requirement to have 380 sessions (190 days) during a school year;
- As we are proposing that school governors will have discretion to determine all 5 INSET days during a school year, we have not included any proposed INSET days;
- In line with school holidays across the UK, Christian religious dates have been incorporated to allow families to observe religious occasions such as Christmas and Easter;
- · Where possible national bank holidays have been incorporated to be during school holidays;
- To review the length of the autumn term when considering where autumn half-term falls;
- · To consider Leicestershire term times alongside neighbouring local authorities;
- . Where possible to try and aim for a summer-break of more than a minimum of three weeks;
- To continue to set the start of the summer break to follow the traditional industrial July fortnight pattern.

All three options:

- Include Christmas holiday, Easter holiday and summer half-term break at similar dates as surrounding areas, including Leicester city.
- Include the traditional early start of the summer holiday. This is similar to Leicester city, but earlier than all other neighbouring authorities.

The key differences between the three options are:

Option 1:

This is the current Leicestershire pattern which includes an early autumn half-term break and an early spring half-term break.


Option 2:

Based on Leicester City's term time pattern – with a later autumn half-term break but maintains an early spring half-term break.

Option 3:


Based on an alternative term time pattern with a later autumn half-term break and spring half-term break.

Options for academic year 2019/20




