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Current Service

- Age 13+
- A telephone helpline for professionals and the public
- Individual and group support for high risk and medium risk victims of domestic abuse and sexual violence

Additional Provision (County)

- The Domestic Abuse Family Recovery Service (£40,000): children, YP and their families to reduce harmful impact of DA upon child (1st October 2018 and ends on 30th September 2019).
- Perpetrator Programme (£10,000):spot purchase of limited places for Perpetrators od DA and COPA programmes (voluntary).

Costings

- The total annual contract price is £826,000, of which £231,300 (28%) is funded by the County Council.
- Partner contributions to the contract value are not expected to change.
- Public Health service currently allocates £115,263 per annum for female victims of domestic abuse within two refuges in Leicestershire.
