
#### National Priorities

- The Transforming Care Programme (TCP) was launched by NHSE in 2015
- National programme to close inpatient settings for people with Learning Disabilities (LD) and/or Autism and to develop community services closer to home
- Each local footprint was required to set up a TCP Partnership Board and to work towards a reduction in the number of local inpatients
- NHSE/I have set a monthly trajectory for Commissioners to work towards with the aim of reducing the number of individuals with LD/ASD being placed into mental health inpatient settings






# LLR Combined Adult and CYP Inpatients vs Trajectory - April 2019 - September 2020

### Learning Disabilities Mortality Review (LeDeR)

- The median age of death for people with a learning disability in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland (LLR) is 59 years old (23 and 27 years less than our LLR population)
- 17% LeDeR referrals are from service who are from a BAME background, this is a lower % than we would expect
- Areas for improvement identified
  - Advanced Care Planning and End of Life Care
  - Communication & care coordination
  - Application of Mental Capacity Act and Best Interest decision making
  - The role of carers in diagnosis and case management
