Electoral Division activities

Main Activities and the impact during the past year:

- Addressed speeding complaints.
- Working with developers to ensure all conditions are being adhered to, so that the developments can progress with the minimal disruption to neighbouring residences.
- Worked tirelessly with the stake holders of Snibston Colliery Park to ensure the future success of the fantastic facility.
- Addressed noise and dust complaints with Bardon Aggregates.
- Secured the single largest grant ever from the Bardon Hill Community Fund for Coalville Town FC, to aid them with their new 3G pitch.

Community Leadership Role

- I regularly attend both Hugglescote & Donington Le Heath Parish Council and Ravenstone with Snibston Parish Council meetings, to deliver my monthly report as well as listen and act on any concerns they have.
- I organised and helped coordinate (alongside the MRC), the Coalville and local area humanitarian aid relief effort, in response to the Ukraine conflict. I then personally led the convoy and drove to the Polish/Ukrainian border to ensure that the aid got there safely and set up local logistics for future aid deliveries.
- Set up meeting with the 2 parishes within my Division to ensure they had a fair share of the Members Highway Fund (MHF) and that the

money was used for the benefit of the parish residents. As Coalville itself does not have a town council I organised and invited local stakeholders NWLDC, Snibston Heritage Trust, Network Rail and LCC to help me transform Mantle Lane Bridge using funding from the HMF. This as become a huge, ongoing project as we all work together to restore what many consider to be the "gateway to Coalville".

- As an active member of the Royal British Legion (Whitwick Branch) as well as being the LCC link councillor, I had the honour of laying the wreath on behalf of LCC on armistice day, I have also organised days out for local veterans as well as raised money for the branch and other veteran's charities. I regularly attend meetings and social events with the branch.
- I have made site visits to local developments, in order to speak with the site supervisors and remind them of their responsibilities of road cleaning, tree and hedgerow protection and correct visible signage.
- I have worked closely with the Coalville Local Area Coordinator, supporting her in her role and assisting wherever possible.
- Actively worked to build strong relationships with local businesses offering my assistance wherever needed, I have tried to visit as many as possible in person to introduce myself and offer them a point of contact should they ever need it.

Engagement with the Council, other statutory bodies and public utility companies (Water, Gas etc) about services in the area

- As one of the few County Councillors who is not a District Councillor also, I have worked hard to forge good relationships with the officers and Councillors (Cross Party) of NWLDC.
- I have formed a very strong working relationship with the local Police NPA commander, by doing so I have direct access to him so that I can report issues immediately.
- I have also been on operational visits to the local Fire Authority, I was given the opportunity to talk to the firefighters in an open forum addressing their issues.
- Opened a dialog with Network Rail in order to address their property obligations across the town.
- Forged a working relationship with a senior engineer at BT Open

reach, allowing for prompt reporting and rectification of their equipment located throughout the town.
