

Appendix – Cervical, Breast and Bowel Screening Uptake in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland by PCN

Figure 1 shows that cervical cancer screening uptake (women aged 25-49) in two PCN's (Soar Valley and Beacon) in Charnwood have a significantly higher rate compared to England. Carillon PCN has the 3rd lowest uptake (58.2%) when ranked against PCNs in LLR and a significantly lower rate in comparison to England (69.1%). There are 4 GP practices in Carillon (3) and Watermead (1) PCN that have significantly lower cervical screening rates in comparison to England and also the lowest rates in the County for both cohorts.



Figure 2 shows breast cancer screening uptake (women aged 50-70) in the last 36 months is significantly higher in comparison to England (61.3%) for all four PCNs in Charnwood, with Soar Valley PCN having the highest rate (76.3%) in LLR.



Figure 3 shows bowel cancer screening uptake (persons aged 60-74) in the last 30 months is significantly higher in comparison to England (66.8%) for two PCNs in Charnwood, with Soar Valley PCN having the highest rate (74.2%) in LLR. Although Watermead PCN has a statistically similar rate as England, there are 2 GP practices within this PCN that are ranked as having the lowest uptake rates in the County.
