We regularly hold Armed Forces meetings with different Committees covering such items as, health and wellbeing, employment, veterans and cadets. I have met with 2 Commodores one from the Navy and one from RAF we were able to discuss the work they do and how we can work with them to help our Armed Forces past, present and future.

We always hold services at County Hall on Remembrance Day, and raise the Flag to support Armed Forces Week.
