---

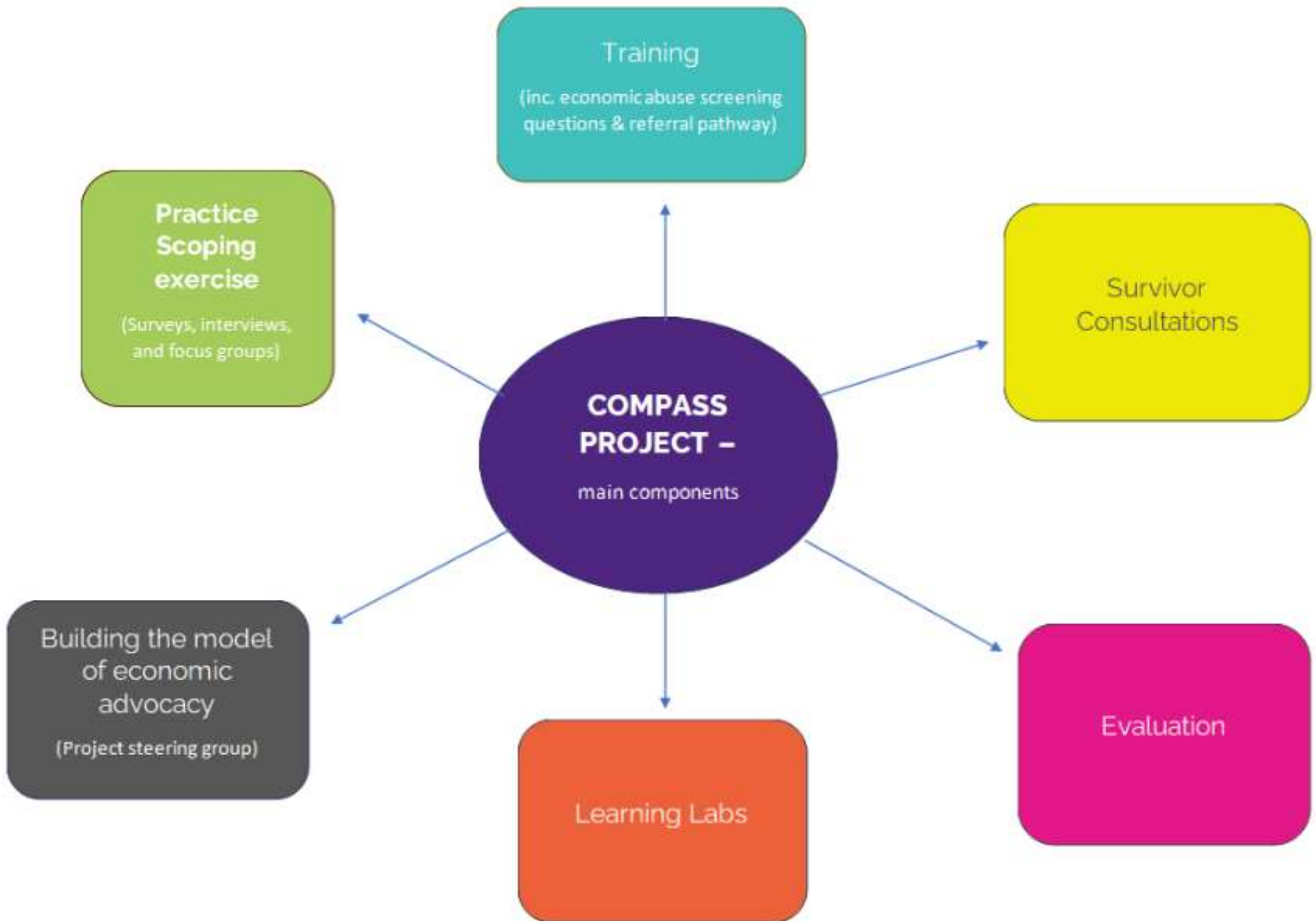


Aims to foster greater coordination between different organisations and agencies to work effectively together to:
