#### County Council, District Council and Parish Council – Case work:

#### 2. School places and SEN transport

Assisted over 20 families with applications for school places and families with SEN transport issues. I worked closely with the CC Cabinet members and Directors of adult and children's services and most of the cases were resolved. However not all the cases could be resolved in the parents' favour.

#### 3. New primary school for Ellistown

It was a pleasure to be invited to the ground-breaking ceremony for the new Forrest School within the Swinfen development. I was alongside the CC Cabinet member of adult and children's services, and we were hosted by Harworth Developers. I also got to cut the ribbon for the opening of the new River Scence woodland walk.





#### 4. Nailstone Country Park

I have volunteered to sit on the Board of Nailstone Country Park and to represent NWLDC. I was honoured to be invited to the opening of the new Nailstone Country Park centre. It is a stunning Eco-friendly building and can be used by the local community.



#### 5. Coalville emergency services open day

Neighbourhood Link is a community messaging service from Leicestershire Police that provides news and information about policing activity or initiatives, crime prevention advice as well as major incidents affecting your area.

Anyone can register, whether you live, work or travel into Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. Registration is free and simple to follow.

Once you have registered you will receive messages via email unless you have specified otherwise. On some occasions it may be appropriate for messages to be sent via text messages or voicemail.
