DELEGATED POWERS TO THE DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENT AND TRANSPORT

The following Delegated Powers should be read in conjunction with all other relevant parts of the Constitution, in particular –

- The General Scheme of Delegation to Heads of Departments (Part 3)
- The Financial Procedural Rules and Standard Financial Instructions (Part 4F)
- The Contract Procedure Rules (Part 4G)

and the Local Conditions of Service.

Officers should also have regard to any departmental rules and conventions before exercising these powers.

NOTE: -

- Any exercise of a delegated power shall not involve a key decision.
- Any delegation to a Head of Department may be exercised on his or her behalf by any officer authorised by him or her either generally or specifically for the purpose.

POWER

COMMITTEE/ SUBCOMMITTEE

Highway matters

1. Private Street Works - Highways Act 1980, Part XI

Power in consultation with the Director of Law and Governance to exercise the functions of the County Council relating to private street works under the legislation in force for the time being.

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2. Public Highway - Regulation and Control

Power to exercise the functions of the County Council in relation to the regulation and/or control of activities in, on, under, over or adjacent to any public highway (including without prejudice to the terms of this authority the granting of consents, issuing permits and licences as well as taking any action considered appropriate to enforce control or to protect the highway and/or highway users and to recover any costs/expenses incurred by the County Council) subject to the concurrence of the Director of Law and Governance where legal proceedings by or against the County Council may be taken.

3. Abandoned Bridges

Power to accept the transfer of abandoned bridges CABINET and/or maintenance responsibility under the legislation 14/06/11 in force for the time being.

4. Urgent Repairs to Private Streets

Power to exercise County Council functions in respect CABINET of urgent repairs to private streets in line with the 14/06/11 legislation in force for the time being.

5. Highway Works by Third Parties

Power to enter into agreements with third parties for a contribution towards highway works by person deriving 14/06/11 14/06/11

6. Maintenance and Minor Highways Schemes

Power to undertake all highways maintenance and
minor highways schemes within the approvedCABINET
24/03/20estimates including any associated Traffic Regulation
Orders, subject to:CABINET
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- (a) a limit of £1m (including the cost of land) in any single case;
- (b) the details of any such minor highways scheme having the support of the local County Councillor(s).

7. Noise Insulation

Power to exercise the Highway Authority's statutory CABINET obligations in relation to noise insulation of properties 14/06/11 resulting from highway schemes.

8. Extinguishment of Highway Rights

Power, subject to any sensitive or difficult cases being reported to the Cabinet for decision, to approve proposals for orders extinguishing highway rights.

9. Highways Dedications

Power to approve dedications of land as public	CABINET
highway which do not involve compensation	14/06/11
negotiations or the transfer of any interest.	

10. Highway Infrastructure Asset Management Plan

Power to develop and implement such operational CABINET procedures as are considered necessary to ensure the effective delivery of the Highway Infrastructure Asset Management Plan.

11. Permit Scheme for Street Works and Road Works

Power, following consultation with the Cabinet LeadCABINETMember, to implement and oversee the on-going15/09/17management, and to make minor changes to, theLeicestershire County Council Permit Scheme as heconsiders appropriate.CABINET

12. <u>Making up and adoption of prospectively</u> adoptable / private streets

Power in consultation with the Director of Law andCABINETGovernance, to exercise the powers and duties of the24/03/20County Council in relation to the making up andadoption of prospectively adoptable / private streets.

Street Lighting

13. <u>Electricity Contracts for Street Lighting and</u> <u>Illuminated Signs</u>

Power, in association with ESPO, to procure through the market energy contracts for street lighting and 14/06/11 illuminated signs.

Public Rights of Way

14. Rights of Way

Power:

- (a) to take any action considered appropriate, including legal action with the concurrence of the Director of Law and Governance, to protect, maintain, improve, keep free from obstructions, waymark and record the public rights of way network, including the power to enter, survey and carry out work on the public right of way pursuant to the relevant legislation in force for the time being. Legal action shall include the serving of notices, issuing of licenses and commencing proceedings;
- (b) after consultation with the Lead Member, to appoint members to the Local Access Forum.

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15. **Highways and Public Rights of Way**

Power, after consultation with the Local Member, to exercise the functions of the County Council and to determine any charge under the Highways Act 1980, the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 and the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 in relation to highways and public rights of way, provided that in the event that the Local Member requests that a report is submitted to the Development Control and Regulatory Board on the matter the power shall not be exercised by the Director of Environment and Transport.

16. Motor Vehicle Trials on Public Rights of Way

Power to determine applications for motor vehicle trials on public rights of way under legislation in force for the time being, subject to prior consultation with the local member for the area concerned and only to grant such licences where traffic could be accommodated within the condition and character of the right of way.

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Traffic and Transport

17. **Minor Transport Schemes**

Power, after consultation with the appropriate Lead Members, to approve details of routine minor transport 14/06/11 schemes in the approved transportation Capital Programme, including associated Traffic Regulation Orders, provided the schemes have the support of the local County Councillor(s).

18. **Public Transport Matters**

Power:

- (a) after consultation with the Lead Member and subject to current approved budget provision to enter into arrangements for the introduction, continuation and/or variation of bus service contracts;
- (b) in appropriate circumstances and subject to the concurrence of the Director of Law and Governance to terminate bus service contracts:
- (c) to take any action necessary to administer the Concessionary Travel Scheme;

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to administer the provision of Home to School and (d) Social Care transport.

19. Traffic Management Act 2004

Power to exercise the following functions on the Council's behalf:

- (a) Part 2 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;
- Part III of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (b) (as amended by the Traffic Management Act 2004);
- (c) Part IX of the Highways Act 1980 (as amended by the Traffic Management Act 2004);
- (d) Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.

20. **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**

Power to exercise the functions of the County Council under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, subject to consultation with the Director of Law and Governance, (including the power to fix any charge or fee) and including the power, where a scheme has the support of the local member(s) and the appropriate Cabinet Lead Members, to overrule objections.

[Note: In cases where the proposal does not have the support required, the matter will be referred to the Cabinet for determination.]

Waste matters

21. Waste Management Licence Applications, Amendments and Reviews

Power, after consultation with the Chairman and Spokesmen of the Development Control and Regulatory Board and the local County Councillor(s), to respond to consultations from the Environment Agency on applications for the licensing of waste facilities.

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22. Arrangements for Interim Residual Waste Treatment

> Power, after consultation with the appropriate Lead CABINET Member and the Director of Corporate Resources to 14/06/11 make provision for additional waste treatment, if that is considered necessary prior to the delivery of long term

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residual waste treatment.

23. Effluent Discharge Consent Applications

Power, in consultation with the Director of Law and CABINET Governance, to respond to notifications of 24/03/20 applications for discharge consents.

24. <u>Coventry and Solihull Waste Disposal Company</u> Ltd

Power to:

- make any and all decisions in respect of the County Council's shareholding in the Coventry and Solihull Waste Disposal Company Limited;
- (b) attend and participate in the Coventry and Solihull Waste Disposal Company Limited Shareholder Panel on behalf of the County Council or to appoint a nominee to attend and participate on the Director's behalf.

Licensing

25. Goods Vehicles Operators Licences

Power to:

- (a) exercise all the functions exercisable by the County Council in respect of the maintenance of the County Council's Goods Vehicle Operator's Licence under the legislation in force for the time being;
- (b) enter objections in relation to goods vehicles operator licences on the basis that this should normally be confined to matters affecting the County Council as highway authority.

26. Licence Charges

Power to review and increase license charges on an annual basis as part of the general review of charges 24/03/20 for County Council services in accordance with legislation in force from time to time.

33. The Blue Badge Scheme

Power to charge a fee no greater than that permitted in the Regulations covering the issuing of disabled blue badges. CABINET 16/06/11

34. High Speed Rail (Phase 2) (HS2)

Power, following consultation with the Lead MemberCABINETand subject to engagement with the relevant local16/10/18members, to respond on behalf of the Council to16/10/18requests and consultations from HS2 Limited.16/10/18
