REVIEW TOPIC	Performance of Leicestershire Police Concerning Rape Cases
RATIONALE	<p>The Police and Crime Panel is responsible for supporting and challenging the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland in his role to hold the Chief Constable accountable for the performance of the force. The Panel is also responsible for Scrutinising the Police and Crime Plan and the PCC's Annual Report.</p> <p>The Police and Crime Plan 2024-29 outlines a mission for Delivering for Victims and Witnesses with a particular commitment relating to Effective Criminal Justice. This includes improved outcomes for victims of crime, ensuring the system works for those who need it most.</p> <p>The PCC's Annual report of 2023-24 outlined a particular focus on Force performance relating to making positive steps to not only reduce the volume of rape and sexual offences committed but also improve the outcomes for victims.</p> <p>A report on rape offences was presented to the Police and Crime Panel on 2 December 2024. The Panel were concerned about the overall performance relating to rape outcomes and the traumatic impact this had on victims. The Panel have therefore requested additional scrutiny of the Police and Crime Commissioner's activity to improve the performance of Leicestershire Police when it comes to Rape cases in terms of outcomes for victims.</p>
PURPOSE OF REVIEW /OBJECTIVES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Scrutinise the PCCs activity to improve the outcomes for victims of rape and make observations on whether the work of the OPCC is having the desired effect. (b) Identify blockages within the criminal justice process in which rape cases stop because investigations/prosecutions are not pursued and consider how the PCC could hold the Chief Constable to account and work with partners in order to address these blockages. (c) Examine the robustness of the reporting process and the effectiveness of victim support services to ensure that victims are supported in taking an investigation forward.
