key successes observed towards driving the enablers for integration	Intermediate Care programme over the last two years has shown marked improved performance in areas of step-up and step-down with particular areas of work such as the commissioning of High Dependency Beds recieving national recognition. Integrated therapy and reablement teams in localities has helped to reduce duplication, improved relationships and improved timescales and outcomes for people recieving support in community settings. This also forms a blueprint for neighbourhood models of care in the 25-26 plan.	
key challenges observed towards driving the enablers for integration	Recruitment to meet demand for certain services remaind a challenge across the system. This is despite investment. To mitigate investment in other teams has helped to bridge any gaps in cpacity to ensure services are as equitable as possible. D2A bedded capacity away from sot-purchasing remains a challenge for the system that will be mitigated in part in 25-26. However, funding to manage the remainder of the demand is going to prove challenging to provide a RRR model for 4 weeks for all who are assessed as needing this type of support.	



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
