2. Overall Commentary on Progress in LAA Delivery for the period

Overall assessment of progress is **Amber**. Whilst the majority of targets are assessed as **Green** it is still early days in terms of delivery and progress towards targets so even where we have been able to measure against the target we can't yet be confident that this will be maintained.

Progress on the Crime Reduction based Indicators (1.1 and 2.1) is still off-target, however specific work has been tasked, targeting at-risk crime-types and locations.

Explanations are given for the other amber and red targets below

3. Report on delivery of activities in receipt of pump priming funding for the reward targets

Pump-primed activities contributing towards the reward targets are being delivered on track.

4. Outcome Areas where the LAA has added value (maximum four examples, please give a brief explanation)

Outcome 5 - Closer working with police has already led to a significant improvement in progress towards reducing first time entrants during October-December 2006. The joint action plan with police should further improve this from April 2007.

5. Red and Amber Outcome Areas (for each one explain why outcome performance is poor and any existing or planned recovery activity).

Two of the three indicators in Outcome 4 are classed as **Amber**.

With regard to Drug Users in Treatment, the National Treatment Agency is very satisfied with Leicestershire's overall performance against this target and reported recently that the Leicestershire DAAT is one of the best performing DAATs in the country for achieving increased numbers of problematic drugs users in treatment.

With regard to Alcohol-related harm the co-ordinating post has only recently been appointed to and indicators are still in development, however these should be agreed by the end of February 2007.

Outcome 7: Reduce vulnerability in priority neighbourhoods, is classed as **Red**. Understanding of and engagement in priority neighbourhood management across the Districts has generally increased. This work in Districts in the North Policing Area of the County, where most of the County's priority neighbourhoods lie, is developing well. However it is unlikely that indicators will have been identified and baselines developed for all neighbourhoods by March 2007.

This also impacts on Indicator 5 within Outcome 6 i.e. to reduce fear of crime and ASB in priority neighbourhoods.
