At the end of September overall crime in Charnwood had been reduced by 14.3%, compared with the start of 2007/08 and domestic burglary is on course for a 40.4% reduction by the end of 2007/08 if current trends continue. In Hinckley and Bosworth crime levels had been reduced by 13.1% at end of September compared with the start of 2007/08 with vehicle crime down by 22.9% and domestic burglary down by 29.6%. Despite these improvements however, it is unlikely that the very challenging overall crime reduction targets will be met by the end of the year.
