THE BLABY COMMUNITY STRATEGY

REPORT OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE

Purpose

1. The purpose of this report is to outline the comments of the five member panel on the consultation draft of the Blaby Community Strategy.

Background

2. The five member scrutiny panel considered the attached consultation draft of the Blaby Community Strategy (Appendix 1). In considering the Blaby Community Strategy the Panel was mindful of the view taken by the Executive (and supported by the Scrutiny Reference Group) that the approach to scrutiny of district based community strategies should not be unnecessarily interventionist. The Panel has therefore not commented on the style or layout of the Strategy and has confined itself to considering and commenting on those elements in the Strategy which impact on or are reliant on the services delivered by the County Council.

Decision of the Panel

3. The Panel noted that the Strategy contained more than 100 references to actions which would require the County Council to have an input. The Panel was of the view that the Cabinet should satisfy itself that the commitments ascribed to the County Council are deliverable, appropriately resourced and consistent with the priorities of the County Council. In particular, the Panel drew attention to the certain commitments which have a specified timescale for completion and may also have significant resource implications. These are set out in **Appendix 2** to this report.

Timetable for Decision

4. In view of the timescale for responding (comments being required by 31 October) the comments of the Panel were considered and endorsed by the Chairman and Spokesmen of the Scrutiny Commission and forwarded to the Cabinet for consideration.

- 5. The Cabinet is due to consider the matter on 29th October (the day the papers for this meeting are being circulated). The Cabinet is being advised to:-
 - give general support to the content of the Blaby Community Strategy on the basis that County Council officers have worked closely with the Blaby LSP in the preparation of the draft strategy and comments of County Council Departments on the pre consultation draft have mostly been taken on board;
 - ii) consider the further comments made by County Council Departments (set out in Appendix 3 to this report) and ask the Blaby LSP to take these into consideration; and
 - iii) authorise the Chief Executive, in consultation with the Leader, to make any further comments in the light of the views expressed by the Scrutiny Panel.

BLABY DISTRICT COMMUNITY STRATEGY

Vision Statement

"To create in partnership with other organisations, an area in which people want to live and work and create in that area the sort of communities in which people want to live"

This first Strategy does not cover every aspect of the lives of the people of the district. It concentrates on those issues which the Blaby District Local Strategic Partnership and local people have said are important to them. The main purpose of the Strategy is to provide a common guide to the priorities which need to be taken into account when planning services and activities so as to make the best contribution to the desired improvements. The other purpose of the Strategy is to enable the people of the district and the Partnership to check on progress.

The Strategy is not set in stone. There will be regular reviews of progress and a system of continuous consultation between the Core Partners and the people of the district to make sure it will not become outdated. Set out at the back of the Strategy is a list of the Core Partners.

There is a contact point and short form at the back of this draft of the Strategy for you to use in making your comments and suggestions.

The Strategy has been set out as a series of themes but it is important to point out that there are some general issues which apply to those themes and to all the other work of the partners. These general issues are just as important as the individual themes and are set out below.

Communication/Service Delivery

- all the partners recognise that it is important to keep you informed.. It is particularly important that account is taken of the increasing use of electronic communication.. There will therefore be a definite emphasis on looking at ways of making increasing use of means such as electronic kiosks, web sites and call centres to allow you to find out what is happening, give your views and access the services which partners provide.

Equal Opportunity/Diversity

- all the partners are committed to the principles of equal opportunity, the elimination of discrimination and an appreciation and use of the wide range of cultural, ethnic and mental and physical abilities available to the district.

Locality

- the district itself ranges in nature from urban to very rural. Taking account of these differences, particularly the problems of rural areas, will be a factor in looking at actions to improve the district.

Joint Working/Coordination

- the partners are committed to working together to avoid duplication of effort, avoid confusing customers and to reduce costs by combining work and budgets when this is possible and to the benefit of the people of the district.

Sustainability

- all the partners recognise the importance of balancing the social, economic and an environmental needs of the district.

Links to Other Plans

The Community Strategy is the big plan but it is not the only plan for Blaby District. The aims are the same as those in more specific plans such as the Crime & Disorder Reduction Strategy, Health Plan, Leicestershire Police Authority Policing Plan, Leicestershire County Council Medium Term Corporate Strategy, Local Transport Plans and the Leicestershire Community Strategy. These other plans will be guided by the Community Strategy on what is important to you as well as being guided by national and local priorities for individual services.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Why do we need a Community Development programme?

- because Community Development
 - Promotes social inclusion, i.e. everyone being able to be involved
 - Helps people to come together to help themselves
 - Builds an awareness of community identity and community responsibility

- Positively influences the health of individuals

Which are the important issues in Blaby District and why?

- Providing more opportunities for people to take part in community activities (many people are not involved)
 - These activities provide positive benefits to communities
- Increasing the opportunities for individuals and community groups to be involved in decision making, including increasing the low participation in elections
 - Creating ways for everyone to provide their views helps provide better information on the communities' needs
- Improving the availability and condition of facilities for the community
 - Which are needed by community groups and others for community activities
- Helping achieve equal opportunities for young people, ethnic minorities, disabled people, people with learning disabilities, vulnerable people and carers
 - So that they can participate more fully in community life
- Continuing to improve access to services and the provision of information
 - So that people's needs can be met more effectively

OVER THE NEXT 10 YEARS WE WILL WORK TOGETHER TO:-

1. INVOLVE MORE PEOPLE IN COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES.

We will do this by.....

Increasing the advice/support to existing Community Groups and helping people to set up new Community Groups by 2004. (BDC, CVS, County Council)

Providing funding for at least 50 Community Groups per year and helping Groups access other sources of funding. (BDC, County Council, CVS).

2. INCREASE THE OPPORTUNITIES FOR INVOLVEMENT BY EVERYONE IN DECISION MAKING

We will do this by...

Introducing a joint approach on consultation by 2004. (BDC, County Council, CVS, Leics. Constab. SLPCT)

Establishing a Voluntary Sector Compact by 2003. (BDC, CVS)

Making more efforts to involve all groups in decision making including young people, ethnic minorities and other 'traditionally excluded' groups e.g. disabled people and people with learning disabilities. (BDC, CVS, County Council, SLPCT, Leics.Constab.)

Supporting and encouraging consultation within communities, e.g. via Village Appraisals and/or Parish Plans in all Parishes by 2013 (BDC, CVS, County Council, Leics. Constab, SLPCT)

Examining alternative voting methods by 2005 (BDC, County Council)

3. IMPROVING ACCESS TO COMMUNITY SERVICES AND FACILITIES

We will do this by...

By 2004 developing a more coordinated approach to provision of services and information including use of e technology (BDC, County Council, CVS, Leics.Constab. SLPCT)

Participating in the County Council's Better Access to Better Services Initiative to improve services and access to services (County Council, BDC, Leics. Constab., SLPCT)

Producing regular newspapers on services and activities and developing links between our Websites (BDC, County Council, SLPCT, CVS, Leics Constab, Parish Councils)

Undertaking an audit of facilities by 2004 and establishing a programme to make better use of underused facilities (County Council, CVS, BDC, SLPCT)

By 2006 looking at ways to secure more community facilities via the planning system (BDC, County Council)

Working together to identify those communities with greatest need for community facilities (BDC, Leics Constab, SLPCT, County Council, CVS, Parish Councils)

Developing or expanding community transport initiatives (County Council, BDC)

Helping Community Groups obtain more advice and funding to improve community facilities. (BDC, CVS, County Council)

Developing more Community ICT Access Points (Leicestershire Rural Partnership, County Council, BDC)

4. **PROMOTE EQUALITY**

We will do this by....

Promoting awareness of and implementing action to reduce discrimination for reasons such as race, religion, disability, mental ill health or gender. (BDC, CVS SLPCT, County Council, Leics Constab, Parish Councils)

Promoting awareness of specific needs of groups including young people, older people, disabled people, people with learning disabilities, vulnerable people, people with mental ill health and carers and providing initiatives to respond to these (BDC, CVS, County Council, SLPCT, Leics Constab, Parish Councils)

Other actions are included in other chapters particularly community safety, leisure/culture, and environment, economy and work and health

COMMUNITY SAFETY

Why should we be working on a Community Safety programme?

- because crime and the fear of crime
 - Has negative impacts on community life and activities
 - Can cause health problems, particularly mental ill health
 - Can reduce employment opportunities through its impact on business
 - Can reduce the quality of the local environment

Which are the important issues in Blaby District and why?

- The need to reduce unnecessary fear of crime
 - The fear of crime causes distress and reduces participation in community life
- Continuing to reduce burglary and vehicle crime

- These crimes cause particular distress to individuals
- How to resolve and further reduce the number of anti-social behaviour incidents
 - This can improve various aspects of community life
- The need to promote awareness of the effect of domestic violence and racist behaviour
 - Domestic violence and racist behaviour are not only crimes but also have negative impacts on individuals' lives
- That young people are more at risk of offending and being victims of crime
 - To help young people be more involved in community life and develop their potential
- Issues arising from drugs use
 - Drugs use can have harmful effects on health and lead to crime

OVER THE NEXT 10 YEARS WE WILL WORK TOGETHER TO:-

1. REDUCE FEAR OF CRIME AND PROVIDE REASSURANCE AS APPROPRIATE

We will do this by...

- Increasing provision of information on initiatives and levels of crime. (BDC, Leics Constab, County Council, Parish Councils)
- Supporting crime reduction initiatives via the Crime Challenge Fund and similar schemes (BDC, Parish Councils,)
- Improve visibility of policing from 2003. (Leics Constab)
- Encouraging layouts and design in new developments which seek to minimise crime (BDC, Leics. Constab, County Council)
- Encouraging the community to become more involved in tackling the fear of crime (Leics. Constab, BDC)

2. REDUCE BURGLARY AND VEHICLE CRIME

- Reducing burglary of people's homes by local Leicestershire Constabulary annual targets. (Leics Constab, BDC)
- Reducing vehicle crime by local Leicestershire Constabulary annual targets. (Leics Constab BDC)
- Demonstrating a more co-ordinated approach to tackling burglary of people's homes and vehicle crime problems by 2004. (Leics Constab, BDC, County Council)
- Promoting prevention and security initiatives to businesses and farmers. (Chamber, NFU, Leics Constab)

3. REDUCE ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR INCIDENTS

We will do this by...

• Demonstrating a more co-ordinated approach to tackling antisocial behaviour by 2004. (BDC, Leics Constab, County Council, Parish Councils)

4. PROMOTE THE UNACCEPTABILITY OF OFFENCES AGAINST INDIVIDUALS, INCLUDING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND RACIST INCIDENTS AND RAISE AWARENESS OF SUPPORT AVAILABLE

We will do this by...

- Further developing the programme of awareness and support initiatives on Domestic Violence by 2004. (Leics Constab, BDC)
- Establishing and maintaining a Diversity Panel by 2004. (BDC, County Council Leics Constab)
- Supporting promotional initiatives per year to tackle racial equality issues. (BDC, CVS, Leics Constab)
- Monitoring the effectiveness of schemes designed to tackle racial equality issues (BDC, Leics Constab,)

5. PROTECT YOUNG PEOPLE FROM BEING INVOLVED IN CRIME, AS VICTIMS OR OFFENDERS, AND INVOLVE THEM IN COMMUNITY SAFETY ISSUES THAT CONCERN THEM

We will do this by...

• Developing initiatives to reduce youth crime by 2005. (Youth Offending Team and Leics Constab)

- Contacting, listening to, and involving young people in identifying, and contributing to community safety issues. (BDC, Leics Constab)
- Further developing a co-ordinated approach to resolve reported incidents of nuisance and anti-social behaviour involving young people by 2003 and assessing the approach by 2004. (BDC, Leics Constab, County Council)
- Reducing alcohol related offences involving young people (County Council & CVS, Leics Constab.)
- Discouraging use of drugs by young people. (BDC, CVS, County Council)
- Encouraging all relevant agencies to work in partnership to address young people's community safety issues. (BDC, Leics Constab, County Council, SLPCT,)

6. TACKLE DRUGS ISSUES IN COMMUNITIES

We will do this by ...

• Continuing the introduction and operation of Communities Against Drugs Initiative projects. (Leics Constab, BDC, County Council, Parish Councils)

Other actions are included in other chapters particularly community development, leisure/culture and environment

ECONOMY AND WORK

Why should we be working on an Economic Development programme?

- because Economic Development
 - Contributes to viability of communities
 - Contributes to well-being of individuals
 - Can provide environmental benefits which could be increased and negative environmental benefits which could be reduced

Which are the important issues in Blaby District and why?

- Continuing to diversify into new types of business
 - These activities provide positive benefits to communities
 - To maintain the low unemployment rate

- Some groups have higher than the district average unemployment rates
 - Improving employment and related opportunities for these groups would benefit the individuals and communities
- Promoting provision of and maintaining the viability of local shops and services
 - These help maintain viability of local communities and reduce the need to travel
- Farmers continuing to diversify including into other farm based businesses and development of other employment opportunities in rural areas
 - Farmers make a significant contribution to protection of the countryside and provision of employment opportunities in rural areas can reduce the need to travel
- Investigating the potential to increase the level of tourism
 - This could provide an additional source of jobs

OVER THE NEXT 10 YEARS WE WILL WORK TOGETHER TO:-

1. SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES

We will do this by...

- Promoting release of previously developed sites for employment use where appropriate (BDC)
- Improving co-ordination of availability of information on funding and training (Chamber, BDC, County Council)
- Working with the LSEP on initiatives to support local business such as helping all business to have access to ICT technology and training (County Council, BDC, Chamber)

2. REDUCE THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN GROUPS WHERE ABOVE THE DISTRICT AVERAGE

We will do this by...

• Developing a co-ordinated approach with the LSEP to introduce employment initiatives for priority groups. (BDC, County Council, Chamber)

- Investigating the opportunities for community based enterprises to provide employment opportunities (BDC, CVS)
- Participating in Welfare to Work initiatives (County Council, CVS, NHS, LSC)

3. HELP IMPROVE THE VIABILITY OF LOCAL SERVICES

We will do this by...

- Developing a co-ordinated approach with the LSEP to assisting viability of local services such as participating in establishment of a Countywide Town/Rural Centres Managers resource (BDC, County Council, Chamber)
- Supporting initiatives such as Rural Centre 'Healthchecks'. (Leicestershire Rural Partnership, BDC County Council, Parish Councils)

4. SUPPORT FARMING AND DIVERSIFICATION IN RURAL AREAS

We will do this by...

- Supporting initiatives to reuse redundant land and buildings, e.g. New Life for Redundant Buildings initiative. (Leicestershire Rural Partnership, BDC, County Council)
- Promoting the role of farming in providing local food and in protecting the countryside (NFU, BDC County Council)
- Encouraging the development of more local food production/processing (NFU, BDC, County Council, Chamber)
- Developing a co-ordinated approach to produce and use crops which provide renewable sources of energy. (NFU, BDC, County Council, Chamber)

5. **PROMOTE TOURISM**

- Developing a Tourism Strategy linked to the LSEP programme. (BDC, County Council)
- Investigating the potential to develop farm based accommodation (NFU, BDC, County Council)
- Promoting and encouraging farmers' and others provision of countryside recreation activities. (NFU County Council, BDC)

• Expanding the information for tourists available in Blaby and at other locations (County Council, BDC)

Other actions are included in other chapters particularly education, environment and transport

EDUCATION

Why should we be working on an Education Programme?

- because Education can help build a competitive and inclusive society by:-
 - Creating opportunities for everyone to develop their learning
 - Releasing potential in people to make the most of themselves
 - Achieving excellence in standards of education and levels of skill

Which are the important issues in Blaby District and why?

- Giving children an excellent start in education.
 - To provide a better foundation for future learning
- Providing young people with opportunities to develop skills and knowledge
 - To help equip them for life and work
- Providing adults with opportunities to develop skills and knowledge
 - To help equip them for life and work
- Making full use of the resources provided by schools for the community
 - To help individuals and communities
- Making full use of the resources provided by libraries for the community
 - To help individuals and communities

NB This Chapter does not cover mainstream education

OVER THE NEXT TEN YEARS WE WILL WORK TOGETHER TO:-

1. GIVE CHILDREN AN EXCELLENT START IN EDUCATION SO THEY HAVE A BETTER FOUNDATION FOR FUTURE LEARNING

We will do this by...

 Working with the Early Years Partnership to support early years provision. (CVS, County Council)

2. ENABLE ALL YOUNG PEOPLE TO DEVELOP AND EQUIP THEMSELVES WITH THE SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE AND PERSONAL QUALITIES NEEDED FOR LIFE AND WORK

We will do this by...

- Working in partnership with the Youth Service and the new Connexions Service to respond to the identified needs of young people in Blaby District. (County Council, BDC, SLPCT)
- Working with other agencies to deliver services targeted at dealing with misuse of drugs and alcohol and associated crimes (County Council, Leics. Constab, BDC, SLPCT)

3. ENCOURAGE AND ENABLE ADULTS TO LEARN, IMPROVE THEIR SKILLS AND ENRICH LIVES

We will do this by...

• Encouraging community development activities that support adult learning opportunities (County Council)

4. WORK WITH SCHOOLS IN CONTRIBUTING TO COMMUNITY LIFE

- Assisting schools to recruit/retain governors. (County Council, BDC,)
- Investigating increasing access to community facilities, especially on educational sites. (County Council, BDC,)

5. WORK WITH THE LIBRARIES AND INFORMATION SERVICE TO ENSURE LIBRARIES PLAY A VITAL ROLE AT THE HEART OF THE COMMUNITY

We will do this by...

- Addressing issues of ensuring access for all persons entitled to use the service in terms of appropriate resources and for all needs and abilities. (County Council)
- Developing the use of ICT Systems and services. (County Council)
- Working with partners to increase wider community use of libraries. (County Council)
- Providing services for special groups e.g. disabled people (County Council)
- Developing services for adults. (County Council)
- Developing services for children. (County Council)

Other actions are included in other chapters particularly community development, economy and work and leisure/culture

ENVIRONMENT

Why should we be working on an Environment programme?

- because protecting and enhancing the environment:-
 - Conserves natural resources and heritage
 - Contributes to active communities
 - Contributes to health of individuals

Which are the important issues in Blaby District and why?

- Reducing the increasing amount of waste produced by individuals and organisations and recycling and reusing more waste.
 - This will improve conservation of our natural resources and reduce pollution.
- Tackling the increases in litter, flytipping and abandoned vehicles.
 - These all reduce the quality of our local area

- Taking action to improve air quality in priority areas and limit the increase in noise levels
 - Poorer air quality can harm peoples health and noise levels reduce quality of life
- The shortage of woodland, loss of wildlife habitats and continuing pressure for new developments on greenfield sites
 - These all affect the number and variety of wildlife species
- Protecting the built heritage
 - This is irreplaceable and important for community sense of identity
- Reducing energy and water consumption by individuals and organisations
 - Providing these resources has a harmful effect on the environment

OVER THE NEXT TEN YEARS WE WILL WORK TOGETHER TO:-

1. REDUCE THE WASTE WE PRODUCE AND REUSE AND RECYCLE AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE

We will do this by...

Working together to achieve a Waste Management Strategy.

Working together to achieve a household waste recovery rate of 33% by 2006. (BDC, County Council, Parish Councils)

Introducing or promoting 3 new reuse or recycling initiatives for trade waste by 2006 (Chamber, NFU, CVS, BDC, County Council)

Increasing the reuse and recycling initiatives in own facilities by 2006. (BDC, County Council, CVS Leics Constab, SLPCT)

Promoting purchase of reused and recycled products. (County Council, BDC, Chamber, Leics Constab, CVS, SLPCT, Parish Councils)

2. REDUCE LITTER, FLYTIPPING AND ABANDONED VEHICLES

We will do this by...

- Reducing litter and flytipping by 2008 by anti-litter education campaigns, more effective enforcement and other initiatives. (BDC, County Council, Leics Constab, Parish Councils)
- Developing a more co-ordinated approach by 2004 to deter the abandoning of vehicles. (BDC, Leics. Constab, County Council)
- Seeking to include litter, flytipping, abandoned vehicles and graffiti in work of any Countywide Town/Rural Centre Managers Group established. (BDC, Chamber)

3. IMPROVE AIR QUALITY AND LIMIT THE INCREASE IN NOISE LEVELS

We will do this by...

- Introducing measures to improve air quality to meet national air quality standards by 2005. (BDC, County Council)
- Working together to identify and implement new opportunities to limit increases in noise levels. (BDC, County Council, Chamber).
- Promoting and using vehicles and fuels which produce less emissions. (BDC, County Council, Leics Constab, Chamber, NFU, CVS, SLPCT, Parish Councils)

4. PROTECT AND ENHANCE OUR NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

- Implementing a co-ordinated approach to encouraging action by individuals and others to help protect our natural environment. (NFU, CVS, Chamber, BDC, County Council)
- Designating more Local Nature Reserves by 2007. (BDC, County Council).
- Increasing the area of major wildlife habitats identified in the countywide Biodiversity Action Plan by 2007. (BDC, NFU, County Council)
- Increasing the proportion of new housing developments and new business developments built on previously developed land. (BDC)

5. PROTECT AND ENHANCE OUR BUILT HERITAGE

We will do this by...

- Designating 5 more Conservation Areas by 2006. (BDC)
- Assisting protection of historic buildings such as farm, commercial, dwellings and other buildings. (BDC, NFU, County Council)

6. REDUCE WASTE OF ENERGY AND WATER

We will do this by...

- Continuing to promote action to achieve the improvement of energy efficiency in households of 30% by 2010 including achieving a minimum Standard Assessment Performance of 8 in Council housing by 2008. (BDC)
- Developing more co-ordinated approach to promoting energy saving and increase the take up of energy saving initiatives by 2008. (BDC, Chamber, CVS, NFU, County Council, SLPCT)
- Continuing to promote use of water saving fittings in households including developing a programme to install water saving fittings in Council housing stock. (BDC)
- Developing more co-ordinated approach to promoting water saving and increase the take up of water saving measures by 2008. (BDC, CVS, NFU, County Council, SLPCT)
- Improving energy and water efficiency in own buildings by 2008. (BDC, Leics Constab, County Council, SLPCT, Parish Councils)
- Promoting enhanced energy and water design criteria in new buildings. (BDC, County Council)
- Promoting and supporting generation of renewable energy and usage of renewable energy tariffs. (NFU, BDC, County Council, Chamber)

Other actions are included in other chapters particularly economy and work, leisure/culture and transport

<u>HEALTH</u>

Why should we be working on a Health programme?

- because :-
 - Good health is fundamental to all our lives
 - Too many people unnecessarily suffer from poor health and are ill for much of their lives
 - Too many people die too young from illnesses that are preventable
 - People can improve their own health
 - Unemployment, bad housing, poor education, and inadequate recreational facilities also affect people's health

Socially excluded groups usually have greater health needs

Which are the important issues in Blaby District and why?

- Co-ordinating the actions of key local agencies to jointly address health and well being of all the groups and communities
 - The actions of a wide range of organisations influence an individual's health
- Encouraging people to take positive action to improve their own health
 - How people live their lives what they eat, how active they are, whether they smoke is central to improving health
- Encouraging communities to improve health in their local area
 - Health is influenced by a wide range of factors such as education, employment, housing, lack of affordable and accessible transport services and access to facilities
- Reducing premature death and seeing more people lead longer, healthier lives
 - The main causes of premature death are: cancer, heart diseases and stroke, accidents and mental ill health
- Improving access to health services
 - To address public concerns regarding access to health services

OVER THE NEXT TEN YEARS WE WILL WORK TOGETHER TO:-

1. CO-ORDINATE THE ACTIONS OF KEY LOCAL AGENCIES TO JOINTLY ADDRESS COMMUNITY HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

We will do this by...
